A More Local Government Friendly PTSI Bill Passes the House

House Bill 1632 passed the House on May 8 in a 154-46 vote.

The League has been working for at least six years to find a compromise on this legislation. As you know, we were seeking to narrow the language and put provisions in place to create a more financially responsible and insurable bill. Our coalition with other local government organizations provided amendment language to the sponsor in mid-April. While our proposed changes were not initially well received, House Bill 1632 was favorably amended before heading to the Floor for a final vote.

Now, under the bill, PTSI must be diagnosed by a licensed psychologist or psychiatrist, which is a welcome change from the previous diagnosis by a licensed medical or mental health professional. There is also a five-year limit on retroactive claims, initially the bill had no time limit for claiming PTSI. A list of qualifying traumatic events has been added providing a level of objectivity to a claim. And, lastly, the effective date was pushed back from 60 days to one year.

We sincerely appreciate the inclusion of some of our proposed language in the bill. We will continue to work in the Senate to modify the bill further.

Thank you to all local officials who contacted their House members to express concern with this bill.
