Who's Your League Advocacy Liaison?

To get the most out of your membership benets, involvement in our advocacy program is essential.

The League values local participation in our advocacy efforts and believes local officials are an asset for communicating the impact of legislation to their Representatives and Senators in the General Assembly.

With this in mind, we recently introduced a new <u>grassroots lobbying tool</u> to make it as easy as possible to be a local advocate. And, as a part of our strategic planning goal, we are asking each member municipality to appoint a Legislative Liaison. This volunteer would support our lobbying efforts and facilitate any requested local action.

A Legislative Liaison should be interested in the legislative process and willing to stay informed of legislation moving in the General Assembly. Ideally, when we send an action call, the Liaison is familiar with the issue and can respond quickly through the grassroots tool. Liaisons should regularly stay up to date with our monthly Legislative Locator and discuss priority legislative issues with their boards in advance. Often action calls are time sensitive and any preparation ahead of time will allow for quick action when needed.

Please bring this request to your board's attention and assist us by identifying a Legislative Liaison.

2025 Bid Limits Announced

The PA Department of Labor and Industry has announced changes to the base amounts triggering the requirement for public bids, telephonic bids, or separate bids, for certain contracts. There is a 2.4% change for this year, which falls under the 3 percent cap. Therefore, the base amount for public bids is \$23,800 and the base amount for written or telephonic bids is \$12,900, effective January 1, 2025. <u>Click here</u> for the complete list of base values.

Pennsylvania Broadband Development Authority - Digital Connectivity Technology Program Round

<u>Two</u> – In 2024, the PBDA opened the Capital Projects Fund - Digital Connectivity Technology (Technology) Program. This program utilized \$20 million of the \$279 million in the Capital Projects Fund that were allocated to Pennsylvania through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021. During 2024, the PBDA distributed over 9,000 laptops to 117 applicants, across 42 counties. These entities included libraries, municipalities, workforce training organizations, not-for-profit organizations, other community anchor institutions, in areas where affordability is a barrier.

The PBDA will open a second round of the Technology Program beginning April 1, 2025, to distribute the remaining laptops. In preparation for this second round, there will be two webinars which will provide an overview of the program, review FAQs, and outline any updates to the guidelines.
